

A study group is a small group of students taking the same class who meet regularly outside of class time. Members of the study group commit to helping each other be successful by working together. A study group is usually formed and run by the students involved.

The typical study group is three to five students who:

- Are taking the same class (not necessarily at the same time)
- Are available at the same time outside of class
- Have similar levels of commitment

A study group is :

- A substitute for attending class
- A substitute for studying on your own
- A way to get others to do your work for you

A social group
Successful study groups:

- Meet 1-3 times per week (may meet more often around test times)

- Have a regular schedule
- Commit
